

Roger had become a pharmacist at Margenau Drug and became very involved with BarberShoppers and church choirs with singing and directing. At the time, son, Kenton, was in 5th grade and daughter, Lori, was in 2nd grade. Roger's musical talents were passed on to the family.

Cannot explain how those years "flew by" but Kent and Lori had successful careers of their own and married. The family became involved with Good Shepherd in Two Rivers.

Lori met Bill Kilps while they were students at Concordia College in Milwaukee. They married at Redeemer, December 1978. They were blessed with two amazing sons. Nathanael is a Middle and H.S. Art teacher at Fredonia. Billy is a semi-truck driver and has a darling son, Wynn, 4, who recently attended Redeemer's VBS.

Redeemer welcomes the entire Gottschalk/Kilps family who have joined our congregation or attend now that Rev. Kilps retired from Good Shepherd. There are many memories from the past as new experiences occur. Lori and Rev. Kilps have both joined our Mixed Choir. Brother, Kenton also joined our Mixed Senior choir as well as Bell Choir. He and his wife Christina live on JJ, almost to Collins Marsh and have five children. They are involved with horses. He, too, has an interesting career. I hope that his story will be written later.

We are fortunate to have Rev. Kilps use his pastoral talents now that he has retired as he has substituted at Redeemer and elsewhere.

Following is more information about Pastor William and Lori Kilps.

Lori Kilps

Lori was born in Beaver Dam, WI, to Roger & Charlotte Gottschalk, and was raised in Shawano where she went to church and school at St. James Lutheran. The family moved to Manitowoc in 1962 and joined Redeemer Lutheran Church. She attended Jackson Elementary and Wilson Junior High, along with her older brother, Kenton, and spent her high school years at Lincoln, graduating in 1973. She was confirmed at Redeemer by Pastor Gumz.

She enrolled at Concordia Junior College in Milwaukee and graduated with an Associate's degree in 1975. She took a year off her studies to join in the Christian touring group, Joy Inc., along with her future husband, Bill. Lori completed her teaching degree with a Bachelor of Arts from Concordia Teachers College, River Forest, Illinois in 1978.

Lori married William Kilps at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Manitowoc on December 30, 1978. A few weeks later, the Kilps moved to Fort Wayne, Indiana where Bill began his studies at Concordia Theological Seminary, earning his Master of Divinity degree in November of 1982. It was there, in Fort Wayne, where Lori would begin her 35-year career as a Lutheran School Teacher.

Following his ordination at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Two Rivers, the Kilps moved to Marengo, Wisconsin, where Rev. Kilps was installed at his first congregation. Shortly after, they welcomed their first son, Nathanael.

Pastor Kilps congregation merged with Trinity Lutheran Church in Glidden, Wisconsin to form a dual parish relationship. The Kilps moved to the parsonage there and two years later, their second son, Billy, was born.

In 1986, Pastor Kilps accepted a call to Zion Lutheran Church in East Moline, Illinois. During this time, both Pastor Kilps and Lori were instrumental in starting a Lutheran grade school in the community as well as a preschool at Zion. Lori served as a teacher/principal at the grade school and as the teacher/director of the preschool.

In 1999 Pastor Kilps accepted a Call to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Two Rivers, back to the congregation where he first was ordained. Lori took over duties there as the preschool teacher/director in the congregation, a position in which she continued to serve for 20 years. In addition to those duties, she also taught four-year old kindergarten for the Two Rivers Public School District in a satellite classroom site at Good Shepherd.

From 2004-2008, Lori taught early childhood education at Northeast Wisconsin Technical College. Many of her students were of Hmong nationality with whom she established a strong and trusted rapport.

In 2014, Mrs. Kilps was duly honored by the South Wisconsin District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, as their Administrator of the Year, recognizing her tremendous achievements in the field of education. She retired from teaching in 2020. The Kilps joined Redeemer in the spring of 2023. Lori immediately became a member of the choir

Music has always been one of Lori's passions, a gift that she came by naturally from her folks, especially her father, Roger, who just celebrated his 71st year in barbershop music/directing. Lori began playing the viola in fifth grade and spent time playing in college orchestras as well as in the Manitowoc Symphony Orchestra. She has always been physically active in running, swimming, hiking and biking. Other hobbies include gardening, camping, reading, and her favorite pastime of being with her four-year old grandson, Wynn. She pledges that one day, she will start quilting again.

Rev. William R. Kilps

The Rev. William R. Kilps was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and raised in the suburb of Hales Corners. He began his education at Hales Corners Lutheran School and spent his high school years at Martin Luther High School in Greendale, Wisconsin.

He enrolled at Concordia College in Milwaukee and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree from Concordia Teachers College, River Forest, Illinois in 1978. In February of the following year, Pastor Kilps entered Concordia Theological Seminary in Ft. Wayne, Indiana.

He was awarded the Maters of Divinity degree in November 1982. A few weeks later, he was ordained into the Holy Ministry at the home church of his wife and in-laws, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Two Rivers, Wisconsin. He then was installed at his first congregation, St. Paul Lutheran Church in Marengo, Wisconsin. Six months later, Rev. Kilps also accepted the Call as pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Glidden, Wisconsin, after the two congregations entered into a dual parish relationship.

Pastor Kilps continued to serve both congregations until 1986, when he accepted the Call to Zion Lutheran Church in East Moline, Illinois. During his ministry there, Rev. Kilps also functioned in other capacities as Circuit Counselor, Second Vice President of the Central Illinois District as a Synodical and District Reconciler and on the Synod President's panel for dialogue with Renewal in Missouri.

In 1999 Pastor Kilps accepted the Call to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, back to the church where he first was ordained. Over the past 23 years, he also served as a Circuit Visitor, has chaired convention committees for the South Wisconsin District, was an adjunct instructor at Concordia University-Wisconsin and is a charter member of Doxology, The Lutheran Center for Spiritual Care and Counsel.

In his retirement, Pastor Kilps plans to pursue his hobbies of golf and photography, spending time with family, camping, and traveling to new destinations.
