Dear Saints of Redeemer,

The unofficial end of summer (Labor Day weekend) is already here. The days are growing shorter. Fall is in sight. Football is back! The Badgers (hopefully) will have defeated Buffalo at Camp Randall by the time you read this. (Who has ever heard of Buffalo?) The Packers are 1-1 in the preseason as I write this. Bow season for deer opens September 16. Cool, crisp mornings are right around the corner. The leaves will begin to change and provide magnificent scenery to God's landscape. Fall is by far my favorite time of the year.

Except, I'm reminded that the changing of the leaves means that they are dying. I'm no botanist, but high school biology taught me that the green-making chlorophyll of leaves declines as the days shorten and the cold weather increases until eventually the chlorophyll production slows to a standstill and disappears. Finally, the tree sheds its leaves. They "fall" and decay upon the earth.

In the beginning, death was not part of God's creative plan. Now, the last enemy to be destroyed is death (1 Cor. 15.26; cf. Rev. 21) – your death and the death of all creation.

For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, by because of him who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God (Rom. 8:19-21).

While the changing of the leaves reminds us of death, in the panoramic scene of things, you may be surprised to learn that it is very much a vital, living process for the trees. If the trees do not lose their leaves, the moisture in the tiny veins of the leaves would freeze and burst rendering the nutrients in the leaves for the tree useless, and the tree would die. Because the leaves fall, the tree receives "new life" in the spring.

To free His creation, God sent His Son, Jesus, to destroy death; to make *all things* new. He died that you may live. And, not just for a time but for an eternity. To be sure, you will walk through the valley of the shadow of death (if Christ doesn't come beforehand). Scary as it may be to think about, fear no evil. Christ died and was raised to life never to die again. Where our Savior goes, we must go.

Death, that last enemy, is our gateway to life and eternal living. In death, the old self "falls" off so that life in Christ is fully realized in your resurrection. In the immediate presence of our God, all stress and pain and tears and heartache and worries are completely absent from our new way of life. Joy and rejoicing shall prevail in eternity.

Until then, we have a foretaste of life with our Lord as He comes to us in His Word and Sacraments. Be comforted knowing that He has already given us new life through His extraordinary means of grace! Happy Fall, y'all!


Classes start on Sunday, September 17 and we will meet every week after Sunday morning worship service until about 11:00 am.

Greetings from Duane Thews who no longer is able to attend Redeemer services. His legs don't allow normal walking but he motors around with his electric wheelchair which he purchased four years ago when he left his home to go to Felician Village and is now at The Court.

Duane, like many, is a transplant to Manitowoc. His parents lived with his grandparents on a farm near Weyauwega, WI where he was also born. His dad was a cheesemaker but when Duane was in 5th grade, his dad purchased the farm and took over responsibilities of ownership;. Duane attended St. Peter Lutheran School in Weyauwega through grade 4 and then a one-room country school for grades 5 through 8 before attending Weyauwega H.S. He remembers doing lots of farm work before enrolling at U.W.-Madison majoring in Spanish and English with a minor in French and later German, graduating in 1958. He had also enlisted in the Army Reserve in 1955 and joined ROTC while in college and earned 2nd Lieutenant status and was in Reserves. He had met Betty when she moved to Weyauwega and was in his year younger brother's class and they started dating.

1958 was an especially busy year. They had gotten engaged, Duane graduated from college and started teaching in Burlington and they married on Nov. 27. After one year, he did six months of active duty in the Army before returning to the classroom at Burlington. He and Betty moved to Manitowoc in 1961 where he taught Spanish in all elementary schools for 4-6 graders and they joined Redeemer. In 1966, Duane accepted a job with U.W.-Eau Claire where he traveled throughout Wisconsin supervising exchange teachers. But the job wasn't quite what he wanted and he resigned in the spring of 1968. He had been friends with Buzz Beckman, who also taught Spanish in Manitowoc. He informed Buzz that he had resigned and was out of a job. Before school started in fall, Buzz had told him a Spanish teacher was needed here and shortly after Supt. Charlie Jones called Duane that a contract was ready for him if he wanted the job. So in 1968, Duane and Betty returned to Manitowoc and Redeemer. Along with teaching at all elementary schools, Duane also taught at Wilson and Washington J.H's and Lincoln H.S. retiring in 1996 after a 37 year career and has not been in a classroom since that time.

Over the years, Duane and Betty were blessed with two children: Pam (David) Roehrig and John (Julie-deceased/Melissa) Thews, two grandchildren and three step grandchildren, a great grandson and two step great granddaughters. Duane also has two brothers, Evan and Don. Betty passed away on Oct. 4, 2014.

Betty had taken Interior Design classes and worked at Rahrs and Sigmans. Duane and Betty also did various traveling over the years. They had taken student groups to Mexico and Spain but also traveled with family to various places in the U.S., Canada, Central and South America and Europe. Duane also spent time in summer school at Guadalajara, Mexico and continued graduate studies at several universities after completing a master's degree at UW-Madison.

Duane and Betty were active members of Redeemer over the years since they joined in 1961, teaching Sunday School and involved in Bible classes. Duane was on Church Council and also congregation treasurer and a Golden K member. Betty was also active in Ladies Aid and Altar Guild.

Duane gets around in his wheelchair. Reading is more difficult but he also enjoys crossword puzzles, watching movies and sports. He greets many friends at Felician Village complex and would enjoy a visit from you.

Curt Kittleson has returned to Manitowoc and Redeemer because God had a plan for him which will be explained later. But, first, let's go back to the beginning of Curt's story.

In 1985 Curt and Annette found Manitowoc their home when he became principal at Madison Elementary and later his talent extended to School Forest leadership. He actually retired twice here in Manitowoc. First as principal in 1996 and then with School Forest in 2002 which he headed for 16 years.

God had more plans for Curt and Annette as they moved to Black River Falls in Jan. 2017 to be near daughter Jody's family. It was a blessing to be supportive to Jody because her husband, Mark Gawron, was diagnosed with cancer for less than a year and was called home to Heaven, Aug. 20, 2018. Meanwhile, Curt and Annette also wanted to come back to Manitowoc to be near daughter, Kim (Don) Hafeman. But they desired a home on Menasha Ave. to be close to Hafemans, as well as to Redeemer, grocery store and gas station. God's plan finally materialized when our last charter Redeemer member, Dorothy Zimmerman, planned to move to Assissted Living at Iron Mountain, MI to be closer to her daughter. Word was given to Curt and immediate plans were made for Curt to purchase Dorothy's home, which he was familiar with. Welcome back to Manitowoc and Redeemer as of July, 2023. God did have plans for you here. Curt says it's good to be back at Redeemer where some of their children and grandchildren were baptized, confirmed and even married.

Curt and Annette were extremely involved while at Redeemer. Both were in choir and teaching. Curt was also on church council for several years and Annette was Sunday. School Superintendent along with being very involved with mission projects for LWML (Lutheran Women's Missionary League). They contributed much to Redeemer. So, greet Curt, who with his daughter, Kim, can be seen sitting on the left front of church. Curt now keeps busy with gardening and simple woodworking projects and thankful God directed him back to Manitowoc.
