FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR HUEHN

The Mission of Redeemer Lutheran is "To grow as <u>followers</u> of Jesus Christ, reflecting the Gospel by word and action everywhere we are."

The word for disciple in the Gospels describes Jesus' followers, including the Twelve Apostles, to whom Jesus said, "Follow Me!" Jesus tells all believers in Him that the larger group of people who followed Him were the same. In Acts, it is used to describe people who believed in Jesus after the apostles spread the gospel. Over 250 times, this important word appears in the New Testament.

In this newsletter, as we grow as followers of Jesus Christ, I will answer the question, "What does it mean to be a follower of Jesus Christ?"

First, it means knowing Jesus as the Son of God and believing in him as one's Savior from sin, death, and the devil. Peter, as one of Jesus' disciples, confessed, "...and we have believed, and have come to know, that you (Jesus) are the Holy One of God." (John 6:69). And the Apostle Peter later confessed about Jesus after He rose from the dead, "And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12)

Second, a follower of Jesus acknowledges Christ's words as the word of God and accepts his teaching as infallible truth. Jesus says, "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life." (John 5:24). And "So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, 32 and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." (John 8:31-32)

Third, a follower of Jesus learns more of Christ and strives to do his will. Jesus says, "Everyone who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock." (Matt. 5:24) . Jesus, in His great commission, also says He sent out apostles as followers of Him, and "teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matt. 28:20) Jesus also said, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him." (John 14:23)


Fourth, each follower of Jesus will pattern his life after Christ and follow his example. Paul writes of Jesus, "Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, six who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be

grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." (Philippians 2:5-8) And Jesus told His disciples, "For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you." (John 13:15)

The Lord blesses us as His chosen people in our baptism to follow Him as His followers, His disciples, and His Christians as he gives us strength to do so by the work of the Holy Spirit at work through the Means of Grace.

Ash Wednesday

The Holy season of Lent begins on March 5th **6:00 PM** Ash Wednesday Worship with Holy Communion and Imposition of Ashes.

The Imposition of Ashes

At Redeemer, as part of our Ash Wednesday devotion, we offer the opportunity to receive "the imposition of ashes" upon the forehead. The following is a brief explanation about this practice.

- **Q.** Are the ashes "blessed?" Do they give a special blessing?
- **A.** No. They are simply a physical symbol to aid in your meditation. The blessings we receive are through God's means of grace, His Word and Sacraments.
- **Q.** Do I have to receive them?
- **A.** No! Any compulsion to receive the ashes would be contrary to the freedom we have in the Gospel. They are simply offered as an opportunity for you. If they will help you, please receive them. If not, please feel comfortable not receiving them. No one will think any less or more of you if you do or don't!
- **Q.** Do I have to leave them on?
- **A.** No. You may wash them off at any time. Again, whatever it most helpful to you. In fact, washing them off can be a joyous thing, as you remember that the water of baptism has rescued you from sin and death!
- **Q.** What about Jesus' words in the Sermon on the Mount (Mt 6:16-18)? Those words read: "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. . . . But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by others . . . "
- **A**. These words of Christ refer to our motivation: "that you may be seen by others." If this is why you want to receive ashes, to be seen by others, you should not receive them! This would be contrary to the Gospel.
